## TRUSTEES' REPORT

## FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2011

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 December 2011.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's constitution, the Charities Act 2011 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005. The Trustees have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission.

#### Structure, governance and management

The charity was set up in 1990 and established by Charitable Trust deed dated 19 January 1992, revised 22 April 2006.

The Trustees have extensive experience in charitable and commercial organisations, and are recruited either as referrals to Nacoa from existing Trustees and Members or as a reflection of considerable or lengthy commitment to the organisation as a volunteer. The Trustees actively seek new candidates to complement and add to the pool of expertise available to Nacoa.

The Board of Trustees who administer the charity meets quarterly. The Consultative Council provides expertise and professional advice pro bono as required. The Chief Executive manages the day to day operations of the charity and within terms of delegation approved by the Trustees, shares operational matters including volunteer management, training and performance related activity. The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

#### **Objectives of the Charity**

The charity's objectives are to address and provide information, advice and support for children growing up in families where one or both parents suffer from alcoholism or a similar addictive problem. This includes children of all ages, many of whose problems only become apparent in adulthood. The activities adopted by the charity in furtherance of these objectives are:

- To offer information, advice and support to children of alcohol-dependent parents
- To reach professionals who work with these children
- To raise the profile of children of alcohol-dependent parents in the public consciousness
- To promote research into:
  - 1. the particular problems faced by those who grow up with parental alcoholism
  - 2. the prevention of alcoholism developing in this vulnerable group of children

These objectives and activities did not change during 2011.

#### **Achievements and Performance**

The charity measures its main achievements and performance by the numbers of contacts – through the helpline (telephone, email, letter), by way of website hits, and contact through Facebook, Twitter and other online activities. A full evaluation of the helpline and related services is completed annually. A summary is shown below:

Since 1990 the Nacoa Helpline has received over 200,000 requests for help and since 2000 the website has received over 500,000 visits. In 2011 we included Facebook, Twitter and responding to Yahoo questions. In 2012 we will install software to receive and respond to SMS and online messaging via our new website.

Full details of our accomplishments against our objectives for 2011 and our objectives for 2012 are reported in our 2011 Annual Report, which is filed with the Charity Commission. #### **Financial Review**

The accounts show that all outgoings were successfully met within income. Spending was kept to a minimum and excluding gifts in kind totalled £120,098. In the current economic climate, it is hard to predict if regular donors will sustain their historic contribution to our work. However 2011 saw an increase in income excluding gifts in kind which totalled £121,629, producing a surplus of £1,531 compared to a surplus of £2,079 in 2010. In addition, the number of hours donated to the charity rose significantly with a commercial value of £189,964 compared to £163,984 in 2010.

#### **Reserves Policy**

A long term aim is to build sufficient reserves to cover at least 6 months' expenditure, and together with the reserves for 2011, the Trustees are happy to report that this objective has been met.

I report on the accounts of The National Association for Children of Alcoholics for the year ended 31 December 2011, which are set out on pages 6 to 14.

# NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2011

#### **1** Accounting policies

#### 1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Charities Act 2011.

#### **1.2 Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in the furtherance of the general objectives of the charity. Designated funds are set aside by the trustees for specific purposes.

Restricted funds are subject to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the fund provider.

#### **1.3 Incoming resources**

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations, membership subscriptions and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has been included in these accounts. Gifts in kind in the form of volunteers' time have been included in the commercial value of their employment as incoming resources for the year.

#### **1.4 Resources expended**

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as liabilities are incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the independent examination fees and costs linked with the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SOFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly; others are apportioned on an appropriate basis.

#### 1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment - 10% Straight Line.

#### 1.6 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
